Friday, June 17th is the last day of regular classes at St. Mary's School. The final exam schedule commences the Monday June 20th and continues until June 27th. **Please be aware that Grade 6-9 exams as well as all Diploma and Grade 12 exams will begin at 8:45am. Grade 10 and 11 course exams please see attached schedule as those start times vary.** Please be diligent in ensuring students arrive on time for exams as late entries often cause significant disruption to students already writing and important writing details are communicated at the beginning of every exam. Additionally, students will not receive extended time when arriving late to an exam.

Students who miss an exam will not be permitted to rewrite the exam unless they have communicated to their teacher the nature of the absence prior to the exam. In cases of emergency circumstances, school administration will intervene on behalf of the student to ensure a reasonable solution. The exam make-up day is only available to students who have rescheduled exams prior to exam week. Students who do not communicate the need for a rescheduled exam in advance, will not be permitted to write on the exam make-up day.

As a reminder, regular classes do not run during the exam schedule and students will not be under teacher supervision after the completion of their exams. The school library will remain open during the exam schedule as a quiet place for students to study. While the school remains open for administration purposes, students are to leave after the completion of their exams. Please contact school administration for clarification or inquiries.

Exams can bring extra stress upon students. While the school staff works faithfully to prepare students for exams, parents and guardians ought to ensure that students are studying, getting enough sleep, and managing stress. Please contact the school's counseling services for support regarding the strategies parents and guardians can utilize for students during exams.





ST. MARTHA



"Jesus loved Martha and Mary and Lazarus." This unique statement in John's gospel tells us of the special relationship Jesus had with Martha, her sister, and her brother. Jesus was a frequent guest at Martha's home in Bethany, a small village two miles from Jerusalem. We read of three visits in Luke 10:38-42, John 11:1-53, and John 12:1-9.

Many of us find it easy to identify with Martha in the story Luke tells. Hospitality is important in the Middle East. Martha welcomed Jesus and his disciples into her home and immediately went to work to serve them. Imagine her frustration when her sister Mary ignored the rule of hospitality and Martha's work in order to sit and listen to Jesus. Instead of speaking to her sister, she asked Jesus to intervene. Jesus' response was not unkind, which gives us an idea of his affection for her. He observed that Martha was worried about many things that distracted her from really being present to him. He reminded her that there is only one thing that is truly important – listening to him. And that is what Mary had done. In Martha we see ourselves – worried and distracted by all we have to do in the world and forgetting to spend time with Jesus. It is, however, comforting to note that Jesus loved her just the same
