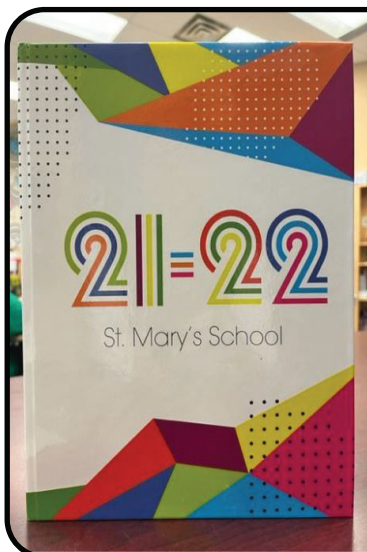

While some students participate in year-round schooling and have been in the classroom for a few weeks – the first day of school for many students and teachers is quickly approaching. I am pleased to welcome back all the students and teachers who are returning and give a warm welcome to those who will be joining us for the first time. I hope you had the chance to rest, relax and recharge over the summer and are ready for an exciting and productive school year.

I am truly thankful for everyone's collaborative efforts in providing a safe and healthy learning environment particularly over the last two years and look forward to a smooth return to in-person instruction. We remain committed to ensuring the health and safety of staff, and students. As we head into the school year, I encourage all students and staff to continue exercising regular personal hygiene and staying home when not feeling well. As I have said in the past it is important that individual family choices continue to be respected related to masking and vaccination. No student or staff member should be stigmatized for their choices.

While the last couple of years has taught us resilience and perseverance, we understand the impacts Covid-19 has had on our young learners' education and mental well-being. We are committed to ensuring our students feel connected and supported in their academic and mental-health needs. Alberta's Government is pleased to commit \$110 million over three years to improve mental health services, provide specialized assessments from qualified therapists and psychologists, and help students get their learning back on track after the pandemic. This is in addition to the over \$1.4 billion in Learning Supports Funding provided directly to school authorities each year. This funding envelope includes the Specialized Learning Supports (SLS) grant, the Nutrition grant, and Program Unit Funding (PUF), which support student mental health, specialized assessments and allow school authorities to provide supports to students and staff.

I sincerely appreciate all the teachers, support staff, school boards, administrators and parents who work tirelessly throughout the school year to prepare students for success and ensure they have the proper supports. Your efforts are both noticed and appreciated.

The school year ahead holds tremendous potential and opportunities for students and educators alike. I am proud of what we have accomplished, and what we continue to work towards – improving education and supporting young Albertans. I wish everyone a happy, healthy, and successful 2022-2023 school year!

Grade 6-8 band students are reminded that they are to be handing in a practice sheet EVERY week. To receive full marks, students must practice 70 minutes per week. Extra practice sheets are available in the band room. Please remember that practice sheets are worth 10% of the band mark.

All band students are reminded that they need to hand in a Home Performance Assignment every calendar month. Forms are available in the band room and are due the first school day of the new month. Students are responsible for playing for an adult at home and having them fill out an evaluation form, as well as the student filling out a self-evaluation. Grade 6's will complete their first assignment in October. October's Home Performance Assignments are due November 1st.

The St. Mary's library has a collection of supplemental music books that are available for band students to check out. These are more popular pieces in the classical, jazz, rock and pop fields. Each one comes with a play-along cd that allows the student to hear background music during the song. These are a great idea for students to get in extra practice minutes, as well as just having fun on their instruments.

Work Experience

Work Experience is a program designed to create an opportunity for students to earn high school credits and experience the World of Work first hand. Students may be in a paid or a volunteer position. Students can earn up to 15 credits towards their High School Diploma. All students **must have** complete the **HCS 3000 Workplace Safety Systems course** before starting work experience and complete the **Off-Campus Work Agreement** form and return it **BEFORE** hours of work will start to be accumulated. Students are responsible for finding their own positions.

Earn while you learn!



Green Certificate Program

This program is a joint endeavor between Alberta Education and Alberta Agriculture and Forestry. Participants learn by actively performing the skills required under the direction of experienced farm personal and provides students with credentials that could lead to a career in agribusiness. Students must complete the AGR3000 Agriculture Safety course before starting the course. Students can earn up to 16 credits towards their High School Diploma . Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP)

This program provides senior high school students the opportunity to earn credits in high school and gain on-the-job training that can be applied towards an apprenticeship. Students can earn up to 40 credits towards their High School Diploma. All students **must have** complete the **HCS 3000 Workplace Safety Systems course** before starting the program and be paid at least minimum wage for their work. RAP students will also receive their Apprenticeship Blue Book.

Dual Credit - In Partnership with Olds College and Lethbridge College

Dual Credit courses are an opportunity for high school students to explore career pathways, post-secondary opportunities, get a head start on post-secondary diploma programs and ease transition from high school to post-secondary while still enrolled in high school. Students will earn credits in both high school & post-secondary at the same time. There are no tuition fees for post-secondary courses completed during high school.



Special Projects

Special Projects are projects that students can pursue in which they have considerable interest or ability but which are not within the scope of the regular curriculum. Students can earn up to 15 credits towards their Diploma.

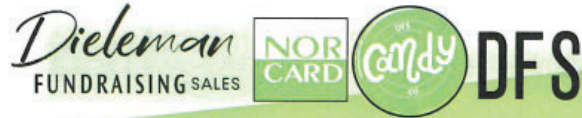

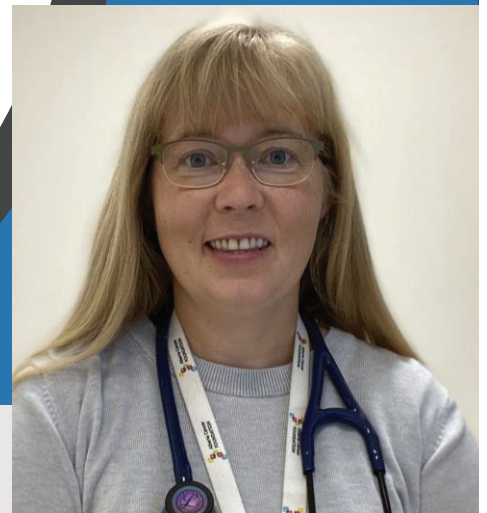
