RE: Student Attendance During Exam Week

Dear Parents & Guardians,

Friday, June 12th is the last day of regular classes at St. Mary's School. The final exam schedule commences on Monday, June 15th and continues until June 25th. **Please be aware that ALL exams will begin at 8:45am for grades 6-12.** Please be diligent in ensuring students arrive on time for exams as late entries often cause significant disruption to students already writing and important writing details are communicated at the beginning of every exam. Additionally, students will not receive extended time when arriving late to an exam.

For all PAT exams in Grade 6 that happen before June 15th, they will be done in class and students will be expected to attend regular class after they are completed writing the exam. (Grade 6 early PAT Dates -June 4 ELA Part B, June 11 Social 6, June 12 Science 6; Early Diploma Exams June 11 Social 30-1 & 30-2 Part A)

Students who miss an exam will not be permitted to rewrite the exam unless they have communicated to their teacher the nature of the absence prior to the exam. In cases of emergency circumstances, school administration will intervene on behalf of the student to ensure a reasonable solution. The exam make-up day is only available to students who have rescheduled exams prior to exam week. Students who do not communicate the need for a rescheduled exam in advance, will not be permitted to write on the exam make-up day.

As a reminder, regular classes do not run during the exam schedule and students will not be under teacher supervision after the completion of their exams. The school library will remain open during the exam schedule as a quiet place for students to study. While the school remains open for administration purposes, **students are to leave after the completion of their exams.** Please contact school administration for clarification or inquiries.

Exams can bring extra stress upon students. While the school staff works faithfully to prepare students for exams, parents and guardians ought to ensure that students are studying, getting enough sleep, and managing stress. Please contact the school's counseling services for support regarding the strategies parents and guardians can utilize for students during exams.

POEDs at SMS

Definitions:

POED: Personally Owned Electronic Devices we are referring to personally owned cell phones, tablets, laptops, and wearable technology such as smartwatches or earbuds.

The following will be the policy followed at SMS:

Grade 6-9

SMS will be moving to a “no cell phone use during the school day” policy for Grades 6-9. Students may bring phones to school, but they must remain stored in lockers during the day, including morning wait time and lunch breaks. If a student needs to contact home, they may use a classroom phone or receive special permission to use their own device.

POEDs Not Permitted during the following:

- 8:00-3:15 (12:05 on Fridays)
- No POEDs in the atrium in the morning or at Lunch time

Cell phones may be stored in the locker or in the office, but NOT IN POCKETS

POEDs Not Permitted during the following:

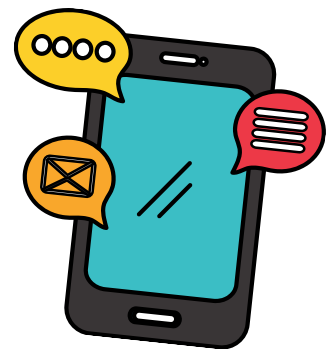
- 8:30- 11:33 (12:05 on Fridays)
- 12:12- 3:14

It must be more than an arm’s length away from the student, and silenced or powered down and not seen and not heard.

POEDs Permitted during the following:

- 8:00-8:30: School is open for Breakfast Program
- 11:33-12:12: Lunch
- When they have a spare, they are allowed to have them in the atrium and library. (they are NOT allowed in the hallways)
- Flex Time in the classroom under the teacher’s supervision

How can I be successful in summer school?

- **Utilize In-Person Support:** If possible, attend Trinity Learning Centre regularly to work on your assignments. Being in a focused environment with direct access to teacher help can significantly improve your progress.
- **Establish a Routine:** Dedicate specific hours each day to your coursework to avoid falling behind.
- **Track Your Deadlines:** Review the July deadline schedule immediately and mark assignment due dates and mid-term and final exam dates in your calendar.
- **Proactive Communication:** Reach out to your teacher as soon as you hit a roadblock, don't wait until the day an assignment is due.
- **Work Ahead:** Take advantage of early access to materials to build a "buffer" in case you need extra time for more difficult units later.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the format of summer school?

Courses are **asynchronous** with no daily lectures. Once registered, you can access materials via Google Classroom or printed booklets. While you may work ahead, **firm deadlines** apply for all assignments and mid-terms starting in July.

How do I get help or feedback?

Teachers are available via **Google Meet, email, phone, or in person** at the Trinity Learning Centre. Please refer to the July teacher schedule for specific availability, noting that times are subject to change.

What is the timeline for completion?

You can start as soon as you receive your materials.

- **Firm Deadlines:** All assignments must be handed in on or before the due date.
- **Flexibility:** You are encouraged to work ahead and finish early if possible.

How do exams work?

English, Social, Math and Science all have a mid-term and final exam. Psychology and Forensic Science all have a final exam. All exams are to be completed in person at Trinity Learning Centre under teacher supervision.

- **Mid-Term:** Needs to be completed on or before **date set by teacher**.
- **Final Exam:** Needs to be completed on or before noon on **Thursday, July 23**.

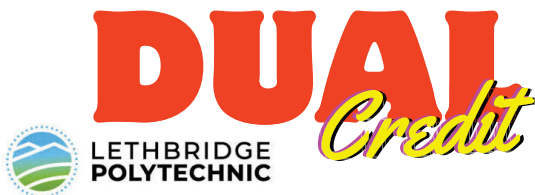

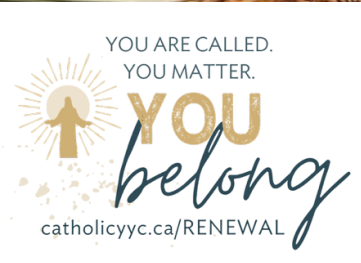
